Saints Chaplet



A chaplet is a vocal prayer and can be prayed as a petition, or in adoration, or for motives of thanksgiving, or in reparation for personal sins or the sins of the nation. It's a personal devotional prayer that can be prayed privately or in a group, out loud or silently, in a church or in an ordinary setting.

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1. Saints Chaplets

Saint Agatha Chaplet

On the Medal pray:

Oh St. Agatha, who withstood the unwelcome advances from unwanted suitors, and suffered pain and torture for your devotion to Our Lord, we celebrate your faith, dignity, and martyrdom.

Protect us against rape and other violations, guard us against breast cancer and other afflictions of women and inspire us to overcome adversity.

Oh St. Agatha, virgin and martyr, mercifully grant that we who venerate your sacrifice, may receive your intercession. Amen.

St. Agatha, pray for us.

On each set of 3 beads Pray:

1 Our Father

1 Hail Mary

1 Glory Be



On the Crucifix Pray

O Heavenly Father, who raised Agatha to the dignity of Sainthood, we implore Your Divine Majesty by her intercession to give us health of mind, body and soul. Free us from all those things which hold us bound to this Earth, and let our spirit, like hers, rise to Your heavenly courts. Through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You, forever. Amen.

• Saint Anne Chaplet

St Anne is the mother of Mary. This chaplet dates to 1875. This chaplet consists of 3 groups of Ave's for a total of 18 beads.

Group one:

1. In honor of Jesus, say one Our Father Prayer and five Hail Mary Prayer

After each Hail Mary say: Jesus, Mary and St. Anne, grant the favor I ask.

Group two:

2. In honor of Mary, say one Our Father Prayer and five Hail Mary



After each Hail Marys say: Jesus, Mary and St. Anne, grant the favor I ask. **Group three:**

3. In honor of St. Anne, say one Our Father Prayer and five Hail Marys After each Hail Mary say: Jesus, Mary and St. Anne, grant the favor I ask.

Closing Prayer: O God, be with us in our time of trial. Protect us, Lord, from every evil. Good St. Anne, you were especially favoured by God to be the mother of the most holy Virgin Mary, the mother of our Saviour. By your power with your most pure daughter and her divine Son, kindly obtain for us the grace and favour that we now seek. Please secure for us also forgiveness for out past sins, the strength to perform faithfully our daily duties, and the help we need to persevere in the love of Jesus and Mary. Amen

• Saint Anthony Chaplet

St. Anthony is the Patron Saint of Lost Items, the Poor and Travelers. The Chaplet of St. Anthony consists of thirteen sets of three beads, attached to this chaplet is a medal of St. Anthony and the Child Jesus.

- Begin by making the Sign of The Cross." On each set of three beads pray one "our Father" on the first bead, one "Hail Mary" on the second bead, and one "Glory Be" on the third bead.
- During each of the thirteen sets of three beads meditate on the following themes:
- 1. St. Anthony, who raised the dead, pray for those Christians now in their agony, and for our dear departed.
 2. St. Anthony, zealous preacher of the Gospel, fortify us against the errors of the enemies of God, and pray for the
 - Holy Father and the Church.

 3. St. Anthony, powerful with the Heart of Jesus, preserve us from the calamities which threaten us on account of our sins.
 - 4. St. Anthony, who drove away devils, make us triumph over their snares.
 - 5. St. Anthony, lily of heavenly purity, purify us from the stains of the soul and preserve our bodies from all dangers.
 - 6. St. Anthony, healer of the sick, cure our diseases and preserve us in health.
 - 7. St. Anthony, guide of travelers, bring to safe harbor those who are in danger of perishing and calm the troubled waves of passion which agitate our souls.
 - 8. St. Anthony, liberator of captives, deliver us from the captivity of evil.
 - 9. St. Anthony, who restores to young and old the use of their limbs, obtain for us the perfect use of the senses of our body and the faculties of our soul.
 - 10. St. Anthony, finder of lost things, help us to find all that we have lost in the spiritual and temporal order.
 - 11. St. Anthony, protected by Mary, avert the dangers which threaten our body and our soul.
 - 12. St. Anthony, helper of the poor, help us in our needs and give bread and work to those who ask.



13. St. Anthony, we thankfully proclaim thy miraculous power, and we beseech thee to protect us all the days of our life. Amen

To complete this chaplet, pray the Miraculous Repository by Saint Bonaventure

• The Miraculous Repository

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Sign of the Cross:

"In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

• Saint Barbara Chaplet

The Chaplet of Saint Barbara consists of 17 beads. The first three beads are said in honor of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The fourteen remaining beads are said to the Blessed Mother; they are placed on this chaplet for Saint Barbara as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers. Saint Barbara is often depicted carrying a chalice representing the Holy Eucharist and a palm branch or (feather) symbolizing martyrdom.

How to pray this chaplet:

Begin by kissing the Crucifix and making the sign of the Cross.

The Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

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On The Crucifix:

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the

Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilot, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell; on the third day He arose from the dead; He ascended into heaven, sitteth at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

On The Medal:

Prayer to Saint Barbara

Saint Barbara, your courage is much stronger than the forces of hurricanes and the power of lightening. Be always by our side so that we, like you, may face all storms, wars, trials and tribulations with the same fortitude with which you faced yours. O Beautiful Maiden once imprisoned in a high tower, protect us from the lightning and fire that rages in the sky and the discord of war. Keep us alert and protect us from the dangers that surround us. Holy Mary Mother of Jesus intercessor for us all; we pray to assure receiving of the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist at the hour of our death. Through Jesus Christ Our Lord, Amen

On The Feather:

Prayer before Martyrdom

Lord God almighty, Father of Jesus Christ, your dear Son through whom we have come to know you, God of the angels and powers, God of all creation, God of those who live in your presence, the race of the just: I bless you. You have considered me worthy of this day and hour, worthy to be numbered with the martyrs and to drink the cup of your Anointed One, and thus to rise and live-forever, body and soul, in the incorruptibility of the Holy Spirit.

Bead 1:

Come, Holy Spirit

Come, Holy Spirit, and fill the hearts of the faithful, and kindle in them the fire of Your Love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth. Amen.

Bead 2:

Fatima Prayer:

O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of your Mercy. Amen.

Bead 3:

Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in Heaven; hallowed by Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. Amen

On the Chalice:

Eucharistic Prayer

Most Holy Trinity, I adore you! My God, my God, I love you in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

14 Beads:

Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Saint Blaise Chaplet

On the medal

Kiss the medal and at the same time, sign your self with The Sign of The Cross

Now pray the:

Preparatory Prayer

Almighty and eternal God! With lively faith and reverently worshiping Thy divine Majesty, I prostrate myself before Thee and invoke with filial trust Thy supreme bounty and mercy. Illumine the darkness of my intellect with a ray of Thy heavenly light and inflame my heart with the fire of Thy divine love, that I may contemplate the great virtues and merits of the saint in whose honor I make this novena, and following his example imitate, like him, the life of Thy divine Son.



Moreover, I beseech Thee to grant graciously, through the merits and intercession of this powerful Helper, the petition which through him I humbly place before Thee, devoutly saving, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Vouchsafe graciously to hear it, if it redounds to Thy greater glory and to the salvation of my soul. Amen.

On the 1st bead pray:

Prayer in Honor of Saint Blaise

O GOD, deliver us through the intercession of Thy holy bishop and martyr Blase, from all evil of soul and body, especially from all ills of the throat; and grant us the grace to make a good confession in the confident hope of obtaining Thy pardon, and ever to praise with worthy lips Thy most holy name. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

On the 2nd bead pray:

Invocation of Saint Blase

Saint Blase, gracious benefactor of mankind and faithful servant of God, who for the love of our Saviour didst suffer so many tortures with patience and resignation; I invoke thy powerful intercession. Preserve me from all evils of soul and body. Because of thy great merits God endowed thee with the special grace to help those that suffer from ills of the throat; relieve and preserve me from them, so that I may

always be able to fulfil my duties, and with the aid of God's grace perform good works. I invoke thy help as special physician of souls, that I may confess my sins sincerely in the holy sacrament of Penance and obtain their forgiveness. I recommend to thy merciful intercession also those who unfortunately concealed a sin in confession. Obtain for them the grace to accuse themselves sincerely and contritely of the sin they concealed, of the sacrilegious confessions and communions they made, and of all the sins they committed since then, so that they may receive pardon, the grace of God, and the remission of the eternal punishment. Amen.

My LORD and my God! I offer up to Thee my petition in union with the bitter passion and death of Jesus Christ, Thy Son, together with the merits of His immaculate and blessed Mother, Mary ever virgin, and of all the saints, particularly with those of the holy Helper in whose honor I make this novena.

Look down upon me, merciful Lord! Grant me Thy grace and Thy love, and graciously hear my prayer. Amen.

On each single bead or usually referred to as the large bead pray: One Our Father

On each group of 5 beads usually referred to as the small beads pray:

A Hail Mary for each bead

• Saint Cecilia Chaplet

On The Crucifix pray the Apostles creed followed by:

St. Cecilia, glorious Virgin and Martyr of Jesus Christ, I admire the courage with which you professed your faith in the face of severe persecution, and the generous love with which you offered your life in witness to your belief in the Blessed Trinity. I thank God with you for the wonderful graces He had bestowed upon you to make your life holy and pleasing to Him even in the midst of the wealth that was yours. I thank Him for the privilege offered to you of receiving the glorious crown of martyrdom. Saint Cecilia, I also admire the purity of love that bound you to the Savior, which was greater in your eyes than any human affection, so that you declared yourself before the enemies of the Church, "I



am the bride of my Lord Jesus Christ." Pray for me that in imitation of you I may keep my body pure and my soul holy, and that I may love Jesus with all my heart. In these times so full of pleasure seeking and so lacking in faith, teach us to profess our faith courageously and to be willing to sacrifice ourselves in practicing it, so that our good example may lead others closer to Christ and the Church He as founded.

On the Bead sets:

In thanksgiving to God for the graces he bestowed on St Cecilia pray:

1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, and 1 Glory be on.

At the end of each bead set say:

St. Cecilia, Virgin and Martyr of Jesus Christ, pray for us.

On the medal of Saint Cecilia say:

St. Cecilia, I confide in your intercession because you generously offered your life as a sacrifice for the love of Jesus, to whom you were devoted with your whole heart and soul. Jesus will not refuse your prayers. Beg Jesus to grant me this favor: (Mention your request.)

For the sake of Jesus Christ, Who filled your heart with pure and heroic love, Who crowned you with the glorious crown of martyrdom, Who permitted your body to remain incorrupt through these many centuries, and Who willed that your memory be praised by the Church at every Holy Day Mass, I earnestly ask you to intercede for me. I resign myself entirely to the Holy Will of God. Help me to imitate your faith and love of God, that I may be ready to make any sacrifice for my Catholic faith. Through your prayers may I someday reach heaven and praise with you the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the loving Spouse of your soul and mine. Amen.

Prayer to Saint Cecilia:

Dear Saint Cecilia, one thing we know for certain about you is that you became a heroic martyr in fidelity to your divine Bridegroom. We do not know that you were a musician but we are told that you heard Angels sing. Inspire musicians to gladden the hearts of people by filling the air with God's gift of music and reminding them of the divine Musician who created all beauty. Amen.

• Saint Charbel Chaplet

Saint Charbel was a Maronite monk from Lebanon. He was born May 8, 1828, and died December 24, 1898. He was beatified December 5, 1965, and canonized October 9, 1977.

THE CHAPLET

The chaplet is made up of five sets of beads, three red, one white and one blue. Five black beads, divide the sets. A medal of the saint connects the beads, with a single white bead following the medal and preceding the five sets.

The <u>red</u> beads are for the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, the virtues by which religious share in the Passion of Christ.



The <u>white</u> beads represent the Holy Eucharist, and the blue beads love and devotion to Our Blessed Mother.

ORDER OF RECITATION

On the first white bead after the medal say the "Father of Truth" prayer. On each black bead recite an "Our Father".

On the first three red beads say the "Hail Mary" in honor of Saint Charbel's fidelity to the vow of poverty.

On the second set of red beads say the "Hail Mary" in honor of Saint Charbel's fidelity to the vow of chastity.

On the third set of red beads say the "Hail Mary" in honor of Saint Charbel's fidelity to the vow of obedience.

On the three white beads say the "Hail Mary" in honor of Saint Charbel's love for the Eucharist.

On the three blue beads say the "Hail Mary" in honor of Saint Charbel's devotion to Our Blessed Mother. Conclude with the prayer to obtain graces on the medal.

Father of Truth Prayer

Father of Truth, behold Your Son, a sacrifice pleasing to You. Accept this offering of Him who died for me; behold His blood shed on Golgotha for my salvation. It pleads for me. For His sake, accept my offering. Many are my sins, but greater is Your mercy. When placed on a scale, Your mercy prevails over the weight of the mountains known only to You. Consider the sin and consider the atonement; the atonement is greater and exceeds the sin. Your beloved Son sustained the nails and the lance because of my sins so in His sufferings You are satisfied and I live.

Prayer to Obtain Graces

Lord, infinitely holy and glorified in Your saints, You have inspired Charbel, the saint monk, to lead the perfect life of a hermit. We thank You for granting him the blessing and the strength to detach himself from the world so that the heroism of the monastic virtues of poverty, chastity, and obedience might triumph in his hermitage. We beseech You to grant us the grace of loving and serving You, following his example. Almighty God, who have manifested the power of Saint Charbel's intercession through his countless miracles and favors, grant us this grace (here mention your intention) which we request from You through his intercession. Amen.

• Saint Dymphna Chaplet

Saint Dymphna is the patron saint of stress, anxiety, and mental health disorders. The Saint Dymphna's Chaplet is comprised of 17 beads. Prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father and for Christians are prayed on the first two white beads. The five red beads are in honor of St. Dymphna's martyrdom, the five white beads are in honor of her virginity, and the five green beads are for the hope for relief for all who suffer from mental disorders.

On the first bead pray the Our Father (For the intentions of the Holy Father)

On the second bead pray the Hail Mary (For the intentions of all Christians)

On the 15 beads remaining, pray the Glory Be

(The 15 Glory Be's are said in honor of Saint Dymphna's 15 years of life.)



Lord, our God, you graciously chose St. Dymphna as patroness of those afflicted with mental and nervous disorders. She is thus an inspiration and a symbol of charity to the thousands who ask her intercession. Please grant, Lord, through the prayers of this pure youthful martyr, relief and consolation to all suffering such trials, and especially those for whom we pray.

[Mention your petitions now]

We beg You, Lord, to hear the prayers of St. Dymphna on our behalf. Grant all those for whom we pray patience in their sufferings and resignation to Your Divine Will. Please fill them with hope, and grant them the relief and cure they so much desire. We ask this through Christ our Lord, who suffered agony in the Garden. Amen.



• Saint Francis Assisi Chaplet

Saint Francis was born in 1181 at Assisi, Umbria, Italy as Francis Bernardone. He was the Founder of the Franciscans. This chaplet is composed of 17 tiger eye beads representing the love St. Francis had for animals, a center piece of the St. Francis, a medal of St. Francis and the Wolf, and a Crucifix. It was created from the Novena of Saint Francis of Assisi, into a chaplet designed by J.S. Kotchka and is used here with permission from the artisan. Begin by kissing The Crucifix and making the sign of the cross.

On bead one pray:

Glorious Saint Francis, who voluntarily renounced all the comforts and riches of your home to follow more perfectly the life of poverty and abnegation of Jesus Christ: obtain for us, we pray, a generous contempt of all things in this world, that we may secure the true and eternal things of heaven.



Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Amen.

On bead two pray:

O glorious Saint Francis, who during the whole course of your life continually wept over the passion of the Redeemer, and labored most zealously for the salvation of souls: obtain for us, we pray, the grace of weeping continually over those sins by which we have crucified afresh Our Lord Jesus Christ, that we may attain to be of the number of those who shall eternally bless His supreme mercy.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Amen.

On the centre piece pray:

O glorious Saint Francis, who, loving above all things suffering and the cross, merited to bear in your body the miraculous stigmata, by which you became a living image of Jesus Christ crucified: obtain for us, we pray, the grace to bear in our bodies the mortifications of Christ, that we may merit one day to receive the consolations which are infallibly promised to all those who now weep.

"If we be dead with Christ Jesus, we shall live also with Him," says the Apostle; "if we suffer, we shall also reign with Him." (2nd Timothy 2.11-12)

Pray for us, Saint Francis, that we may obtain the graces and favors we ask for in this novena; pray for us, especially, that we may obtain the grace of perseverance; of a holy death and a happy eternity.

On the five sets of three beads

1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be

Conclude the chaplet by saying the Prayer of Saint Francis of Assisi

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.

Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen

Saint Francis Xavier Carbini Chaplet

This Chaplet has 25 beads, 5 sets of 5 beads, and a medal of Mother Cabrini.

On each of the beads, say the "Hail Mary". At the end of each set of 5 beads, say the following prayer:

"O My Saviour, hear Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini plead for me.



• Saint Gemma Galgani Chaplet

The chaplet of Saint Gemma Galgani, has a medal of her likeness and is made up of 25 beads representing her life on earth. The 20 Crystal beads are for her Memorial Day April 1, and 5 Aquamarine beads are for her Birthday March 12. The centre roses are for your petition to her when praying the chaplet.

On the medal pray:

The Most Glorious St Gemma Prayer: O Most Glorious St. Gemma, Mirror of innocence and penance, may we who humbly invoke thy Heavenly intercession obtain from thee the grace of purity in all our thoughts, words and actions. Amen

On the set of 2 beads pray:

O my soul, bless Jesus. Never forget the many graces He has given thee. Love that God who so loves thee. Lift thyself up to Him, who has lowered Himself for thee; show thyself as He shows Himself with thee; be clean of heart, be pure. Love thy Jesus, who has lifted thee out of so much misery. Love thy God, bless thy Lord



On the centre:

Pray the Saint Gemma Petition Prayer.

"Dearest St. Gemma. Sister and friend in Christ; You know the value of suffering and the blessings of healing. Please pray that Our Lord will heal me/us and my/our family of my/our, physical, emotional and spiritual ailments, Through Christ, Our Lord. Amen"

On the first set of 5 pray:

"Jesus, let me come to thee, I thirst for thy life-giving blood." Followed by 5 Hail Mary's

On the next bead pray:

If I saw the gates of Hell open and I stood on the brink of the abyss, I should not despair, I should not lose hope of mercy, because I should trust in You, my God. Followed by One Our Father

Continue to the end of the chaplet in this pattern. At the end of the chaplet pray again The Most Glorious St. Gemma Prayer.

Saint Gerard Chaplet


This chaplet is composed of a nine-bead configuration (3 groups of 3) with a St. Gerard medal on one end and a Holy Family medal on the other.

There are two sets of prayer to use for this chaplet. One is for expectant mothers followed by: 3 Our Fathers, 3 Hail Marys, and 3 Glory Be's or

The one for motherhood followed by: 3 Our Fathers, 3 Hail Marys, and 3 Glory Be's

FOR AN EXPECTANT MOTHER

Great St. Gerard, beloved servant of Jesus Christ, you are a perfect imitator of our meek and humble Saviour, and a devoted child of the mother of God. Enkindle in my heart one spark of that heavenly fire of charity that glowed in yours and made you a beacon of love.



FOR MOTHERHOOD OR OTHER SPECIAL FAVOR

Most Blessed Trinity, I, Your child, thank You for all the gifts and privileges which You granted to St. Gerard, especially for those virtues with which you adorned him on earth and the glory which you now impart to him in heaven. Accomplish Your work, O Lord, so that Your Kingdom may come about on earth. Through his merits, in union with those of Jesus and Mary, grant me the grace for which I ask...And you, my powerful intercessor, St. Gerard, always so ready to help those who have recourse to you, pray for me. Come before the Throne of Divine Mercy and do not leave without being heard. To you I confide this important and urgent affair. Graciously take my cause in hand and do not let me end this novena without having experienced in some way the effects of your intercession. Amen.



• Saint Joan of Arc chaplet

The chaplet may be used as a novena (a prayer repeated once every day for nine days) or prayed at any time for any necessity throughout the year. A total number of nineteen beads on this chaplet commemorates each year of Joan's life.

On the medal, make the sign of the Cross, recite:

"Incline unto my aid, Oh God! Oh Lord, make haste to help me! Amen."Follow this with a: Glory Be.

On the first single bead on the strand, pray an: "Our Father".

On the second single bead on the strand, pray an:

"Our Father", and then continue by saying, "Saint Joan of Arc, immolated as a victim of the burning stake, pray that I may also become a victim by the faithful practice of all my duties as they pertain to me during my whole life."



On the first group of five beads, say a:

"Hail Mary" for each bead.

On the next divisional bead, pray an:

"Our Father", and then recite,

"Saint Joan of Arc, with you, I only wish to find my delight in practicing humility, charity, and penance, and all the virtues necessary to gain entrance into Heaven. Saint Joan of Arc, pray for us!"

On the second group of five beads, say a:

"Hail Mary" for each bead.

On the next divisional bead, pray an:

"Our Father", and then recite,

"Saint Joan of Arc, be with me in all my struggles. Like the strong men of Israel, experienced in warfare, who constantly carry the sword at their side, to guard against unforeseen attacks during the night, may I ever be prepared for the combat. Together with the protection of the angels and saints grant me also your own; inspire my endeavours; be my help and my light to guide me to Jesus, our Chief, and when my earthly mission is accomplished, may I expire like you, repeating with love, Jesus! Jesus! Jesus! - Saint Joan of Arc, pray for us!"

On the third group of five beads, pray a:

"Hail Mary" for each bead.

On the Medal of Saint John Vianney pray The Peoples' Prayer for Priests followed by 5 Our Fathers, 5 Hail Marys, and 5 Glory Be to Father.

Or on the Medal of Saint John Vianney pray the priest's Prayer for Priests followed by 5 Our Fathers, 5 Hail Marys, and 5 Glory Be to Father.

To you I have recourse from the depth of my heart and humbly request assistance. Help me in my present and urgent petition. In return, I promise to make your name known and cause you to be invoked.

Say three Our Fathers, three Hail Marys and three Glorias. This novena, if said in good faith, has never been known to fail and must be said for nine consecutive days.



• Saint Kateri Indian Rosary

A Chaplet of Prayer dedicated in honor of the Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, the Lily of the Mohawks.

Order of Recitation.

1. Kiss the Cross and make the Sign of the Cross with it. Saying, "In the name of the Father, of the Son and the Holy spirit.

Amen "

Ask God to make Kateri a Saint, and petition Kateri to help you in your personal needs.

- 2. Recite an "Our Fahter" on each of the 8 Brown Beads: a "Hail Mary" on each of the 8 Red Beads; and a "Glory Be" on each of the 8 Crystal Beads.
- 3. Make the Sign of the Cross as above.



Explanation, Meaning, Intention of the Rosary. The Cross.

The Cross is of Sturolite," Nature's amazing wonder mineral found in the shape of tiny crosses in the Blue Ridge mountains of Virginia, North Carolina, and New Mexico. It is an Indian legend that on the day that Christ died on the Cross, the woodland animals wept, their tiny tears falling upon the earth and crystallizing into these tiny crosses.

The 24 Beads

Kateri, whose name means, "Putting all things in order" and "Moving all things before her," was 24 years young when she departed from this world, which she loved so much, and joined her beloved Rawen-ni-io, the God Who creat4d this beautiful World, gave her an immortal soul, and set it afire with a consuming love for Him. The 24 Beads portray Kateri's short, yet so fruitful 24 years upon this Earth.

Brown Beads (8 Our Fathers)

Earth colors were very popular with the Indians; Brown is the predominant color of the Earth. It must have been one of God's most favorite colors. The moccasins which Kateri and her people wore were brown, too. God, the Father, gave us this World in perfect order. Ask Blessed Kateri's intercession before God to set this Earth, our minds, our bodies, and all our problems in order again.

Red Beads (8 Hail Marvs)

Red is the traditional color of Love. Love runs in the red blood of all mankind, transcending race and color. God must have had a particular love for this part of the Continent when he colored its first inhabitants Red. Indians have an innate love for all mankind as their brothers. Moonstone red is for the high form of love we must have for each other, and the great love that Kateri had for Our Blessed Mother. Ask Kateri's intercession to Mary to form this kind of love in all our hearts, and to lead us back to Christ.

Crystal Beads (8 Glory Be's)

Indians believed that the crystal-clear lakes and streams were the tears of the Great Spirit. Mary the Holy Trinity, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, through Kateri's prayers, restore the beauty of our waters, skies, forests, and air - the ecology of our entire World.

On the circle of 12 Chaplet beads pray the:

St. Maria Goretti, beloved daughter of Jesus and Mary, pray for us who have recourse to thee. Amen.

In conclusion pray:

Hail, O illustrious St. Maria Goretti, who shed your blood in order not to offend God through mortal sin! I bless the Lord for all the graces He has bestowed upon thee during thy life, and especially at thy death. I praise and glorify Him for the honor and power with which he was crowned thee, and I beg thee to obtain for me from God the graces I ask through thy intercession. Amen



The chaplet consists of a medal of Saint Mary of Magdalen, and 10 beads plus 3 for a total of 13 beads.

On the Medal say:

Saint Mary Magdalen, friend, and follower of Jesus, help me to recognize my sins so that I may seek forgiveness and that I too may be exorcised by Him. Pray for me so that I too may be closer to Jesus and love him as my Divine Savior. Pray for (mention your petition here) so that they too may see our Lord Jesus Christ and seek forgiveness for their sins so that they too may always seek the Lord and follow him. Help us to persevere to the end so that we will be saved.

The recitation of this chaplet is intended to seek the powerful intercession of this Martyr of Charity who Pope John Paul II has referred to as the "Patron of our Difficult Century" and the "Prophet of the Civilization of Love." St. Maximilian himself had noted that those in heaven, unrestricted by earthly cares or concerns, can indeed work "with both hands" for the special needs of those who call upon them for help.

The Chaplet consists of a medal of St. Maximilian Koble and a total of 15 beads. (14 red beads and 1 white)

How to pray:

On the white bead pray the Memorare. This prayer is a reminder of the filial love and unwavering trust St. Maximilian had for Our Lady.

On the fourteen red beads, representing Kolbe's death on August 14, the Miraculous Medal Prayer adapted by St. Maximilian is recited.



Memorare

Remember, O Most Gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to Thy protection, implored Thy help, or sought Thy intercession was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, I fly to Thee, O Virgin of Virgins, my Mother, before Thee I come, before Thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in Thy mercy, hear and answer me. Amen.

Miraculous Medal Prayer (adapted)

O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to Thee, and for all those who do no have recourse to Thee, especially for the enemies of Holy Mother Church, and all those in most need of Thy mercy.

Invocation:

St. Maximilian Kolbe, pray for us!

Begin on the medal with the prayer of St. Monica:

"O holy Monica, by your burning tears and unceasing prayers, you did save your son from eternal damnation. Obtain for us the grace ever to comprehend what is most conducive to the salvation of our children, so that we may effectively restrain them from the way of sin and lead them by that of virtue and piety to heaven!"



On the first pendant bead, pray:

Our Father

On the second pendant bead, pray:

Come, Holy Spirit

On the loop:

For each group of five, on the large bead, pray one of the petitions below, followed by Hail Mary on each of the four small beads:

- 1) I join my tears to yours against the spirit of Despair, toward the spirit of Hope-Saint Monica, pray for me (us) in the Holy Name of Jesus! 4 Hail Marys.
- 2) I join my tears to yours against the spirit of Anger, toward the spirit of Love-Saint Monica, pray for me in the Holy Name of Jesus! 4 Hail Marys.
- 3) I join my tears to yours against the spirit of Blame, toward the spirit of Forgiveness -Saint Monica, pray for me in the Holy Name of Jesus! 4 Hail Marys.
- 4) I join my tears to yours against the spirit of Suspicion, toward the spirit of Trust-Saint Monica pray for me in the Holy Name of Jesus! 4 Hail Marys.
- 5) I join my tears to yours against the spirit of Doubt, toward the spirit of Faith-Saint Monica, pray for me in the Holy Name of Jesus! 4 Hail Marys.

6) I join my tears to yours - against the spirit of Fear, toward the spirit of Peace-Saint Monica, pray for me in the Holy Name of Jesus! 4 Hail Marys.

Returning to pendant, on the first bead pray:

"Saint Monica, Exemplary mother of the great Augustine, you perseveringly pursued your wayward son not with wild threats but with prayerful cries to heaven. Intercede for all mothers in our day so that they may learn to draw their children to God. Teach them how to remain close to their children, even the prodigal sons and daughters who have sadly gone astray."

On the next pendant bead, pray:

"O great Saint Augustine, take our children under your protection! To our efforts in their behalf, join your intercession for them with God. Exert all your influence and, with the compassion of your loving heart, intercede with the Most Holy Trinity for them. Stay with me, Lord, because I am weak and I need Your strength, that I may not fall so often.

Second single Bead pray:

I bless You, O Jesus, for having elected the Apostle Paul as a model and preacher of holy virginity. And you, O St. Paul, my dear father, guard my mind, my heart and my senses in order that I may know, love and serve only Jesus, and employ all my energies for His glory.

Saint Peregrine Chaplet

Born wealthy, he spent a worldly youth, and became involved in politics. He received a vision of Our Lady who told him to go to Siena, Italy, and there to join the Servites. After training and ordination, they assigned him to his home town. He lived and worked, as much as possible, in complete silence, in solitude, and without sitting down for 30 years in an attempt to do penance for his early life. When he did speak, he was known as a fervant preacher. A victim of a spreading cancer in his foot, Peregrine was scheduled for an amputation. The night before the operation, he spent in prayer; that night received a vision of Christ who healed him with a touch. The next morning, Peregrine found his cancer completely healed.

The Chaplet to St. Peregrine is prayed on a nine bead chaplet, with a medal of St. Peregrine on one end, and a crucifix on the other. It is a powerful chaplet for those who are fighting cancer, to give them strength and hope.

Introductory prayer on the crucifix:

O God, who gave to St. Peregrine an angel for his companion, the mother of God for his teacher, and Jesus as the physician for his malady, grant we beseech you through his merits, that we may on earth intensely love our holy Angels, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and our Saviour; and in Him bless them forever. Grant that we may receive the favour which we now petition: (present your request). We ask this through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.



On each bead pray:

One our Father, one Hail Mary, one Glory Be, and 'St. Peregrine, pray for us.

• Saint Philomena Chaplet

St. Philomena is a most powerful helper of students at examinations. She cures the sick in the most desperate cases. She obtains great help for mothers at childbirth. The Chaplet of St. Philomena consists of a Medal of her likeness with 3 white beads in honor of the three Divine Persons of the Blessed Trinity in thanksgiving for all favors obtained through her intercession, and 13 red beads representing the thirteen years she spent on earth.

On the medal pray:

The Apostle's Creed - to ask for the grace of faith.

1st White Bead pray:

The Our Father - in honor of The Father

2nd White Bead pray:

The Our Father - in honor of The Son

3rd White Bead pray:

The Our Father - in honor of The Holy Spirit

On each Red Bead pray:

Hail, O holy St. Philomena, whom I acknowledge, after Mary, as my advocate with the Divine Spouse, intercede for me now and at the hour of my death. St. Philomena, beloved daughter of Jesus and Mary, pray for us who have recourse to thee. Amen.

In conclusion say:

Hail, O illustrious St. Philomena, who shed so courageously your blood for Christ! I bless the Lord for all the graces He has bestowed upon thee during thy life, and especially at thy death. I praise and glorify Him for the honor and power with which He has crowned thee, and I beg thee to obtain for me from God the graces I ask through thy intercession



• Saint Rita Chaplet

The chaplet in honor of St. Rita, patroness of the impossible, consists of nine beads. The chaplet is comprised of three sets of three prayers, completed with the recitation of the prayer to St. Rita. Intentions may be made at the beginning or end of the chaplet.

On The Crucifix sign yourself:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

First three beads:

Recite the Our Father

Second three beads:

Recite the Hail Mary

Last three beads:

Recite the Glory Be to the father

On the medal of Saint Rita:

O Holy St. Rita, exemplary Augustinian Sister, we honor you for your devotion to the Passion of Christ. Although your early life was filled with disappointment, frustration, and unceasing tragedy, you never lost faith and trust in God. For this you are the patroness of the impossible, and our inspiration and advocate in desperate circumstances.

The Lord's Prayer

Our Father Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

The Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace! the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of they womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

• Saint Therese Chaplet

This chaplet consists of 25 beads. The 24 beads commemorating the 24 years of Saint Therese's life, and one additional bead.

On the one bead the following ejaculation is said: Saint Therese of the Infant Jesus, Patroness of Missions, pray for us.

On the other 24 beads is said:

The Glory be to honor the Holy Trinity in thanksgiving for having given us the Little Saint who lived in this world but 24 years.



• Blessed Miguel Pro, S.J. Chaplet

"Long Live Christ the King!"

These words rang out clearly as a volley of bullets ripped into the body of the brave young priest. It was 1927, and it was a crime to be a Catholic in Mexico.

The chaplet consists of a crucifix followed by six white beads symbolizing Miguel Pro's purity and eleven red beads that recall his martyrdom.

On the crucifix (or medal of Blessed Miguel if you have one attached) say:

Before your death you told your friend to ask you for favors when you were in heaven. Dear Blessed Miguel, I beg you to intercede for me. In union with Our Lady and all the angels and saints, please ask Our Lord to grant my petition, provided that it be the will of God. (Here mention your request.)



We honor and adore the triune God. Glory Be.

We ask the Holy Spirit for guidance. Come, Holy Ghost.

We pray Jesus taught us to pray. Our Father.

We venerate with love the Virgin Mary. Hail Mary

All you angels, bless you the Lord forever.

Saint Joseph, Saint (name of your patron) and all the saints, pray for us.



On the read beads that symbolize his martyrdom:

Blessed Miguel, high-spirited youth, pray for us. Viva Cristo Rey.

Blessed Miguel, loving son and brother, pray for us. Viva Cristo Rey.

Blessed Miguel, patient novice, pray for us. Viva Cristo Rev.

Blessed Miguel, exile from your homeland, pray for us. Viva Cristo Rey.

Blessed Miguel, prayerful religious, pray for us. Viva Cristo Rey.

Blessed Miguel, sick and suffering, pray for us. Viva Cristo Rey.

2. Our Lady Rosary and Chaplets

• 7 Joys of Mary, Franciscan Crown Rosary

The use of this rosary was begun in the Order of St. Francis in 1422. It is said that a certain novice, before joining the Order, was accustomed to place a crown on a statue of the Blessed Virgin. When he was not allowed to continue this practice, he resolved to leave the Order. Then Mary appeared to him and dissuaded him, telling him he could offer a much more pleasing crown by reciting a rosary of 7 decades in honor of her Seven Joys. This is the most highly indulgenced of all the types of rosaries. The Franciscan Rosary of the Seven Joys of the Blessed Virgin Mary is composed of seven decades of 1 Our Father and 10 Hail Marys each. At the end 2 Hail Marys are added, and is concluded with the Our Father and Hail Mary. The last Our Father and Hail Mary are said for the intention of the Pope in order to gain the indulgence. The 72 Hail Marys commemorate the seventy-two years the Blessed Virgin Mary is supposed to



have lived on earth. The seven decades need not be recited at once, but the single decades may be separated provided that the whole Rosary is said on the same day. It is not necessary to meditate on the mysteries of this Rosary, it suffices to say the single decades in honor of the respective mystery.

The following are the mysteries of the Franciscan Crown:

First Mystery:

The Immaculate Virgin Mary joyfully conceived Jesus by the Holy Ghost.

Second Mystery:

The immaculate Virgin Mary joyfully carried Jesus when she visited Elizabeth.

Third Mystery:

The Immaculate Virgin Mary joyfully brought Jesus into the world.

Fourth Mystery:

The Immaculate Virgin Mary exhibited Jesus to the adoration of the Magi.

Fifth Mystery:

The Immaculate Virgin Mary joyfully found Jesus in the Temple.

Sixth Mystery:

The Immaculate Virgin Mary joyfully beheld Jesus after His resurrection.

Seventh Mystery:

The Immaculate Virgin Mary was joyfully received by Jesus into heaven, and crowned Queen of heaven and earth.

• 7 Sorrows of Mary

Opening Meditation

In the Sorrows of the Virgin Mary we see a reflection of the suffering and bitter anguish of the human Christ. Just as Mary accepted the total mystery of Christ into her life, so may we see in our sorrow, our fear, and humiliation, a dim, but real participation in His passion and death, recalling that if we wish to follow Him, we must "take up our cross" each day. Let us pray that we may accept Christ's call, and become cosufferers of His passion.

I THE FIRST SORROW

The Prophecy Of Simeon

Many of us are parents. We know that only by sharing life with God is life fulfilled. That is why we also sense a fear about the future of our loved ones. Simeon's prophecy was a blessing for all mankind, but foretold grief for you, Mary. Your first sorrow was much more than a parent's fear. (One Our Father Seven Hail Marys)



II THE SECOND SORROW

The Flight Into Egypt

What can a mother do when the life of her child is threatened? When Herod decreed death for all those innocent children, God warned Joseph. With no time for packing or goodbyes, you escaped into the night. Homeless and tired, with an uncertain future before you, you were secure in nothing but the love of those who needed you.

(One Our Father... Seven Hail Marys)

III THE THIRD SORROW

The Loss Of Jesus In The Temple

A child is lost. What panic grips the hearts of parents at such a time! They wonder, "Is he safe?" "Will I ever see him again?" And then they imagine things too terrible to express. It was the same for you and Joseph. Mary, for three days you sought Jesus. It took faith to continue the search in the pain of separation.

(One Our Father ... Seven Hail Marys)

IV THE FOURTH SORROW

Mary Meets Jesus On the Way To Calvary

What mother called suddenly to the hospital to see her sick or injured child has not wished: "If only I could suffer instead of you!" But she remains only a spectator. Mary, you saw Jesus beaten and bloody. You felt powerless to help Him, and yet through your love you shared His pain.

V THE FIFTH SORROW

Jesus Dies On The Cross

It has often been said, "To lose a child is the worst death for a parent to endure." Mary, in those long hours, at the cross, perhaps your thoughts returned to earlier days. How horrible now to face the reality of death! His breath grew labored. The time had come. Yet He spoke to you and consoled you. In dying he gave life to others and made you mother of all mankind.

VI THE SIXTH SORROW

Mary Receives The Dead Body of Jesus

He is dead . . . and it hardly seems real. How many of us have paused before the body of a loved one and wondered: "Can this be happening to me?" Death is real, all too real! As you held Jesus in your arms, Mary, you probably wondered as we have, "Is this the end of everything?"

VII THE SEVENTH SORROW

Jesus Is Laid In The Tomb

The garden and the bomb . . . there is something strangely consoling about the burial of Jesus, Mary. Perhaps a flower or blade of grass reminded you of his words "Unless a seed falls to the ground and dies, it cannot produce new life." It is always difficult to see death and life together, but you continued to believe, hope, and love. His words filled your heart.

(One Our Father Seven Hail Marys)

Closing Prayer

Lord God, our Father, from the passion and death of Jesus, shared by the compassion of his Mother, you brought healing to fallen man. Grant that we, your people, may experience this healing and rise from the power of sin to a wholeness of life promised by Jesus, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever, AMEN. (Three Hail Marys)

THE SERVITE ORDER: Toward the middle of the thirteenth century seven Florentine merchants formed a penitential community just outside Florence. Aware of their unworthiness before God, they dedicated themselves as Servants of the Holy Virgin so that she might be with them as they stood before their Lord. To escape the distractions of urban life and civil discord they withdrew to Mount Senario, some twelve miles distant. In its solitude they laid the foundation of the Order Of Servants of Mary. Their example attracted many followers and soon foundations were made in Italy and Germany, and later in many other countries. These Seven whom our Lady guided to found an Order dedicated to her service were canonized in 1888 as the Seven Holy Founders.

From this example of prayerfulness joined to an active ministry spread a movement which includes eleven canonized saints, many blessed whose cult is approved by Rome, and innumerable holy men and women of many countries and times. While the devotion of Servites has always been directed to the Mother of their Lord in all the aspects of her life, in time it began to be focused more specifically on the sorrows she experienced in her life. The black habit of the Servites was itself looked upon as a sign of the sorrow Mary suffered at the Cross of her Son.

At the present time Servites are present on all continents: priests and brothers, cloistered nuns and active sisters, members of the Servite Secular Institute, Servite Third Order, and Confraternity of Our Lady of Sorrows. In the United States the Servites are best known for their Marian shrines of Our Lady of Sorrows Basilica in Chicago where the Novena to Our Sorrowful Mother began in 1937 and the Shrine of Our Sorrowful Mother in Portland, Oregon.

THE ROSARY OF THE SEVEN SORROWS: During the Middle Ages, when the ordinary Catholic no longer knew the language of the official prayer of the Church, many other prayer forms or devotions developed to fill the prayer vacuum that resulted. One of these was the rosary. And one of the adaptations of this prayer-form was the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows of Mary. Like all rosaries, the Servite Rosary is a meditation on the mystery-events of God's love for us as reflected in the life of Jesus and Mary. Specifically, it invites us to meditate on those times in the life of Mary when she experienced the pain and suffering that tested her faith and invited her to a full sharing of the mystery of God's salvation in her Son, Jesus. By this reflection, in the context of verbal prayers of Our Fathers and Hail Marys, we open our hearts to the power of this mystery, and so allow His Word to enter and change our lives. This Servite Rosary consist of Seven Mysteries of Sorrows. Each mystery is introduced by a meditation to guide our reflection as we pray the Our Fathers and seven Hail Marys. The Rosary is concluded with three Hail Marys, as added petition for true sorrow and a desire to model our lives on the example of the life and faith of Mary. For more than 740 years, the members of the

Servite Order have been know as "The Servants of Mary." Their work for Jesus and Mary is world-wide.

• The Angelus Chaplet

The Angelus Chaplet consists of 7 beads, a Crucifix and Miraculous Medal. The Angelus Chaplet was designed and created by Terrance J George III

How to pray:

The Verse and Response are said on the 4 clear beads. The Hail Mary is said on the 3 dark blue beads. V. The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. R. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary, full of grace, The Lord is with Thee; Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, Pray for us sinners, Now and at the hour of our death. Amen

• Brigittine Rosary

The Brigittine Rosary consists of 6 decades of 10 beads each. There are 3 additional beads at the end. Each decade consists of 1 Our Father, 10 Hail Marys. The Apostle's Creed is said on the crucifix.

Apostle's Creed: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified; died, and was buried.

At the large blue beads (Our Father in heaven)

At the small red beads (Hail Mary, full of grace)

The **63 Hail Marys** are in remembrance of the 63 years of Mary's earthly life according to one traditional account.

The **7 Our Fathers**, said on the large beads between each decade, are in remembrance of the Seven Sorrows and Seven Joys of the Blessed Virgin.



• Chaplet of Conversion

The chaplet is made up of a cross, three small beads, and five sets of five small beads separated by five large beads. There are 33 beads in all. We offer this very beautiful chaplet, requested by Our Blessed Mother, for the conversion of the souls of the world in these times that are serious and urgent. She gave it to a chosen soul in Ireland but asked that it be prayed widely. It begins:

Say the Creed for the unbelievers of the world.

Say one Our Father in petition to the father for the grace of conversion for the world. Say one Hail Mary, honouring the Father for the exaltation of Mary, a mere creature, and for choosing to honour her with the title: Queen of Heaven and Mediatrix of all graces.

Say one Hail, Holy Queen.



Repeat the section below five times.

On the large beads of each mystery say once:

O Holy Mother, I join you at the foot of your Son's Cross to implore mercy and conversion for the souls of the world. With you I offer the wounds of your Son Jesus to the Father in atonement for the sins of the world, past, present and to come.

On the small beads say five times:

Through the sorrowful, bleeding, Immaculate Heart of Mary, and in union with the suffering of her Son Jesus on the Cross, I implore from the Father the grace of conversion for the world.

At the end of each little mystery of five invocations, say one Hail Mary in honour of Mary's tears of sorrow, followed by this short prayer:

Holy Mother Mary, Mediatrix of all graces, obtain for us from God the conversion of the world.

At the end of the chaplet say three Glory Be's in honor of the Blessed Trinity, and conclude with the Hail, Holy Queen.

• Immaculate Conception Chaplet

This chaplet consists of three groups of four beads each. A large bead separates each group, and a medal of the Immaculate Conception is attached to the end. It was composed by St. John Berchmanns, S. J. and recited by him daily to obtain, through the intercession of Mary, the grace never to commit any sin against the virtue of purity.

How to say this chaplet:

Make the sign of the Cross:

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

On the first single bead of group 1:

Blessed be the Holy and Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Then say an:

Our Father....

On the next four beads say;

a Hail Mary for each bead

after the last Hail Mary say one Glory be to the Father...

On the next single bead of group 2:

Blessed be the Holy and Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Then say an;

Our Father....

On the next four beads say;



a Hail Mary for each bead after the last Hail Mary say one Glory be to the Father...

On the next single bead of group 3:

Blessed be the Holy and Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Then say an;

Our Father....

On the next four beads say;

a Hail Mary for each bead

after the last Hail Mary say one Glory be to the Father...

• Immaculate Heart of Mary Chaplet

Feast: The Saturday following the 2nd Sunday after Pentecost (the Saturday after the Feast of the Sacred Heart)
In honor of the Immaculate Conception of Mary and reverence for purity.
Notes from those who honor The Immaculate Heart of Mary:

St. Jerome (4th century) wrote, "Other creatures have been given graces drop by drop, but Mary's Heart has been flooded with the fullness of grace."

St. Gertrude the Great and St. Mechtilde (12th century) "My daughter," Our Lord said "if you would please Me, offer unto Me the purest of all hearts,-the most humble and most loving of all hearts, - the Heart of My Mother".

Blessed Henry Suso (mystic of the 14th century) was told by Our Lady, "The more your souls shall have been attached to me by a pure and spiritual love during life, the more closely shall you be united to my Heart during eternity."



In the 15th century there was St. Bernardino of Siena, then St. Francis de Sales in the 16th century, and St. John Eudes in the 17th century, and many, many others.

This chaplet consists of a medal of the Immaculate Heart, 5 blue, 5 red, and 5 gold beads for a total of 15 beads.

Method of Recitation:

On the medal:

"Praise to you Most Holy Trinity for the graces, privileges, and blessings bestowed on the Immaculate Heart of Mary!"

On the blue beads, in honor of the Joys of Mary's Heart:

Pray on each bead, one Glory Be... plus "Rejoice and be glad Immaculate Heart of Mary".

On the red beads, in honor of the Sorrows of Mary's Heart:

Pray on each bead, one Glory Be... plus "Blessed be the sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary."

On the gold beads, in honor of the Glories of Mary's Heart: Pray on each bead one Glory Be... and "Triumph and reign, O Immaculate Heart of Mary!"

Conclude on the medal:

"Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Thy kingdom come through the Immaculate Heart of Mary! Immaculate Heart of Mary, be my refuge! St. Joseph, spouse of the Immaculate Heart, pray for us!"

the other Our Father and Hail Mary are in honor of Our Lord, King of the Apostles.

While reciting these prayers one should meditate on the 12 articles of the Apostles' Creed and pray for the safety of the Holy Father, the Pope and the welfare of the Church.

This chaplet is designated especially for the Augustinian secular tertiaries.



• Our lady of Czetochowa chaplet

O Almighty and merciful God! You gave the Polish nation a wondrous help and defense in the most holy Virgin Mary, and You honoured Her sacred image Jasna Gora with remarkable veneration of the faithful. 



At the end of each five bead set recite: (clear bead)

"Oh My Jesus, grant that our prayers may turn the tears of Our Lady Of Sorrows into the smile of Our Mother of Joy"

When you are finished recite the closing prayer.

Closing Prayer

Dear Mother or Joy, we ask that our small acts of self-denial be pleasing to your Son as we strive to imitate your way of life... always willing to respond to God's



call. We humbly ask you pray for us: we entrust our souls under your Motherly protection and pray that one day you will present us to your divine Son, Jesus Christ, who reigns with God the Father Almighty, for all eternity. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.. Amen.

According to the testimony of the witnesses, Our Lady introduced herself:

Second Meditation

My child, it is necessary to keep close to My Divine Son, especially in the Blessed Sacrament.

Third Meditation

I am the Mother of the hopeless; Mother of Sorrows. It is important for those that are suffering to come to me for consolation and for comfort.

Ten Evangelical Virtues of the blessed Virgin Mary

The chaplet is comprised of ten black beads, with a crucifix on one end and a medal with an image of Mary Immaculate on the other. The Chaplet of the Ten Evangelical Virtues of the Blessed Virgin Mary This prayer, contained in the Rule of the Ten Virtues of the Blessed Virgin Mary, has been passed on by tradition in the Marian Order. It is meant for private recitation on the rosary. First of all we make the sign of the Cross, then we recite one Our Father followed by ten Hail Mary's, mentioning after the words "Holy Mary, Mother of God" one virtue, in the following order:

- 1. Most pure,
- 2. Most prudent,
- 3. Most humble,
- 4. Most faithful,
- 5. Most devout,
- 6. Most obedient,
- 7. Most poor,
- 8. Most patient,
- 9. Most merciful,
- 10. Most sorrowful,





Pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death.

- V. Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.
- V. In Your Conception, O Virgin Mary, You were Immaculate.

In honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Say one Our Father and three Hail Marys

Third Meditation:

The Sorrows of Mary.
Say one Our Father and three Hail Marys

Fifth Meditation:

In atonement to the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Say one Our Father and three Hail Marys

At the end on the medal say:

The prayer to the United Hearts of Jesus and Mary:

O United Hearts of Jesus and Mary, Thou art all grace, all mercy, all love. Let my heart be joined to Thine, so that my every need is present in Thine United Hearts.



Most especially, shed Thy grace upon this particular need [mention it]. Help me to recognize and accept Thy loving will in my life. Amen

3. Our Lord Chaplets

• <u>15 Secrets tortures and suffering of our lord and savior Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u>

This chaplet consists of 15 beads + 3 beads at the beginning.

Revealed to the pious, God-loving Sister Mary Magdalen of Sancta Clara Order, Franciscan, who lived, died and was beatified in Rome. Jesus fulfilled the wish of this Sister, who desired to ardently know something about the secret sufferings which He endured the night before His death.

On the first 3 beads is said:

"I looked for one that would comfort me, and I found none" followed by an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be....

On each single bead meditate upon the secret tortures and sufferings.

On the Crucifix say the prayer that Jesus gave to Sister Mary Magdalen of Santa Clara.

The Fifteen Secret Tortures and Suffering of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ

- 1. They fastened My feet with a rope and dragged Me over the stepping stones of the staircase, down into a filthy, nauseating cellar.
- 2. They took off My clothing and stung My body with iron joints.
- 3. They attached a rope around My body and pulled Me on the ground from end to end.
- 4. They hanged Me on a wooden piece with a slip knot until I slipped out and fell down. Overwhelmed by this torture, I wept bloody tears.
- 5. They tied Me to a post and pierced My body with various arms.
- 6. They struck Me with stones and burnt Me with blazing embers and torches.
- 7. They pierced Me with awls; sharp spears tore My skin, flesh and arteries out of My body.
- 8. They tied Me to a post and made Me stand barefoot on an incandescent metal sheet.



- 9. They crowned Me with an iron crown and wrapped My eyes with the dirtiest possible rags.
- 10. They made Me sit on a chair covered with sharp pointed nails, causing deep wounds in My body.
- 11. They poured on My wounds liquid lead and resin and, after this torture, they pressed Me on the nailed chair so that the nails went deeper and deeper into My flesh.
- 12. For shame and affliction, they drove needles into the holes of My uprooted beard. They tied my hands behind My back and led Me walking out of prison with strikes and blows.
- 13. They threw Me upon a cross and attached Me so tightly that I could hardly breathe anymore.
- 14. They threw at My head as I lay on the earth, and they stepped on Me, hurting My breast. Then, taking a thorn from My crown, they drove it into My tongue.
- 15. They poured into My mouth the most immodest excretions, as they uttered the most infamous expressions about Me.

Then, Jesus added,

"My daughter, I desire that you let everybody know the Fifteen Secret Tortures in order that everyone of them be honored." "Anyone who daily offers Me, with love, one of these sufferings and says with fervor the following prayer, will be rewarded with eternal glory on the day of judgment."

Prayer:

My Lord and My God, it is my unchangeable will to honor you in these Fifteen Secret Torments when You shed Your Precious Blood; as many times as there are grains of sand around the seas, as fruit in the orchards, as leaves on the trees, as flowers in the gardens, as stars in the sky, as angels in Heaven, as creatures on earth. So many thousands of times may you be glorified, praised and honored, O Most love-worthy Lord Jesus Christ - Your Holiest Heart, Your Precious Blood, Your Divine Sacrifice for mankind, the Holiest Sacrament of the altar, the Most Holy Virgin Mary, the nine glorious choirs of Angels and the Blessed Phalanx of the Saints, from myself and everyone, now and forever, and in the eternal ages. In like manner, I desire, my dear Jesus, to give You thanksgiving, to serve you, to repair and atone for all my ignominies, and to offer You my soul and body as Your possession forever. Likewise, I regret all my sins and beg Your pardon, O my Lord and my God. 

Byzantine Rosary, "Chotki"

Eastern Orthodox Rosary. This Oriental form of rosary is known in the Hellenic Greek Church as Chaplet or String of Knots of Beads, in the Russian Church as Vervitza (string), chotki (chaplet), or liestovka (ladder), and the Rumanian Church as matanie (reverence). Our everyday name of "beads" for it is simply the Old Saxon word "bede" (a prayer) which has been transferred to the instrument used in reciting the prayer, while the word rosary is an equally modern term.

The Rosary prayed by the Eastern Orthodox is a string of 33, 100, or 300 beads on a string or knots made of wool; they are not divided into decades. On each bead or knot is prayed the following mantra: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me, a sinner."



Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

Both this mantra and the Glorious mantra above are derived from the Gospel story of the Pharisee and the tax collector.

The Russian Rosary

(A slightly different version of the Byzantine Rosary)


The Eastern rite rosary dates back to the 7th century, when according to tradition, a saint had an apparition recommending this form of prayer. In Russia, the rosary is called "Chotki." It is usually made of wool in which there are 100 knots with an extra know between each ten. At the end is a cross also make of knots. St. Basil the Great used a rosary very similar to the type now used.

The customary prayer used is the ejaculation of the publican, who stood at the back of the Temple and said: "Lord have mercy on me a sinner." Our Lord says he went out justified, thus indirectly recommending this prayer. The Russians call this prayer the prayer of Jesus and have several variations of it:

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on us.

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Lord Jesus Christ, by the prayers of Our Lady, have mercy on me.



Sometimes they also use:

Most holy Lady, Mother of God, Pray for us sinners.

The Russian Rosary Begins:

O God, cleanse me, a sinner (3 X).

O heavenly King, Paraclete, Spirit of Truth, who art present everywhere and dost permeate all things, Treasury of blessings and Giver of life, come and take up Thy dwelling within us. This dates back to the 7th century, when according to tradition, a saint had an apparition recommending this form of prayer. In Russia the Rosary is called "Chotki." It is usually made of wool in which there are 100 knots with a large knot at each decade. St. Basil the Great used a rosary of this.

The customary prayer is the "Chotki" is an adaptation of the humble prayer of the publican, who cried out: "O God, have mercy on me, a sinner."(Luke 18;9-4) The Lord Jesus said that he went out from his prayer "justified."

Early Christians adopted this prayer for their own use, and added to it the Prayer of Jesus or The Jesus Prayer and have several variations of it: Lord Jesus Christ have mercy on me.

or

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me.

or

Lord Jesus Christ, by the prayers of Our Lady, have mercy on me.

The Byzantine Rosary Begins:

O God, cleanse me, a sinner (3 X).

O heavenly King, Paraclete, Spirit of Truth, Who is present everywhere and permeate all things, Treasury of blessings and Giver of life, come and dwelling within us. Purify us from every fault and save our souls, O gracious Lord. Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Imortal One, have mercy on us. (3 X) Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and always and forever. Amen.

O holy Trinity, have mercy on us.

Lord forgive us our sins.

Most Holy God, pardon our transgressions.

Do You who are holy visit us and heal our infirmities for Your name's sake.

Lord, have mercy on us (3X).



7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the remaining decades

Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. Optional Closing Prayers

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

O Greatly Merciful God, Infinite Goodness, today all mankind calls out from the abyss of its misery to Your mercy — to Your compassion, O God; and it is with its mighty voice of misery that it cries out. Gracious God, do not reject the prayer of this earth's exiles! • Crown of our lord

The Crown of Our Lord consists of 33 beads -- 3 decades and 3 additional beads commemorating the 33 years of the earthly life of Our Lord. There are two methods of reciting this crown.

The first method is as follows:

Having made the sign of the cross say:

O God incline unto my aid;

O Lord make haste to help me

The mystery is then announced, e.g.:

Jesus, Who sweat blood for us, etc.

Then follow 1 Hail Mary, 10 Our Fathers, and 1 Glory Be.

These are all to be repeated 3 times.

Then add 1 Hail Mary, 3 Our Fathers, and another Hail Mary.

The 5 Hail Marys are to commemorate the Five Holy Wounds.

The second method consists of

meditating on an event from the life or passion of Our Lord while saying the prescribed Our Father or Hail Mary.

Begin on the Crucifix

Pray an Act of Contrition.

(2) Our Father

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

(3) The Memorare

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that any one who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, and sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother; to thee I come; before thee I stand sinful and sorrowful. Holy Face Chaplet

The Chaplet of the Holy Face comes from Sr. Mary of St. Peter, a Holy Carmelite Nun of Tours, France, given to her by our Lord November 15, 1843.

The cross reminds us of the mystery of our redemption.

Sign yourself with the Cross and say: O GOD, incline unto my aid!: O Lord, make haste to help me!: Then Glory Be ...

Now go to the first decade bead after the medal, on each of the 6 beads say:

Arise. O Lord and let Thy enemies be scattered And let them that hate Thee flee from before Thy Face. Then say Glory be to recall the sense you wish to honor.

On the Our Father beads say:

"My JESUS Mercy"
Repeat this sequence till you come to the medal

On the Medal say:

O GOD, our protector, lookdown upon us, And cast Thine eyes upon the Face of Thy Christ!

The last 3 beads mark JESUS public life, on them we honor all the wounds inflicted upon His adorable Face! Treat these beads the same saying on the Our Father beads "My JESUS Mercy" proceeded by a Gloria, then the "Arise O Lord." When done, the Glory Be, is recited 7 times in honor of the 7 last words of JESUS upon the Cross, and the 7 Dolars of the Immaculate Virgin.



• Holy Spirit Chaplet

The Chaplet of the Holy Ghost was composed in 1892 by a Franciscan Capuchin missionary of the English province in order to give the faithful an easy means of honoring the Holy Ghost.

THE FIRST MYSTERY

By the Holy Ghost is Jesus conceived of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Meditation:

The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the Power of the Most High shall overshadow thee; and therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. (Luke, I, 35) The Practice:

Diligently implore the aid of the Divine Spirit, and Mary's intercession, to imitate the virtues of Jesus Christ, Who is the Model of virtues, so that you may be made conformable to the image of the Son of God.



The Spirit of the Lord rested upon Jesus when he was baptized.

The Meditation:

Jesus, being baptized, forthwith came out of the water: and lo! the heavens were opened to Him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove, and coming upon Him. (Matthew, III, 16)

The Practice:

Hold in the highest esteem the priceless gift of sanctifying grace, infused into your soul by the Holy Ghost in Baptism. Keep the promises to which you then pledged yourself. Increase, by constant practice, Faith, Hope, and Charity. Ever live as becometh children of God and members of God's true Church, so as to obtain, hereafter, the inheritance of heaven.

THE THIRD MYSTERY

By the Spirit is Jesus led into the desert to be tempted by the Devil.

The Meditation:

Jesus, being full of the Holy ghost, returned from the Jordan, and was led by the Spirit into the desert for the space of forty days; and was tempted by the devil. (Luke, IV, 1-2)

The Practice:

Be ever grateful for the sevenfold gift of the Holy Ghost bestowed upon you in Confirmation, for the spirit of wisdom and understanding, of counsel and fortitude, of knowledge and piety, and of the fear of the Lord. Faithfully yield to His Divine guidance, so that, in all the trials and temptations of life, you may act manfully, as becometh a perfect Christian and valiant soldier of Jesus Christ.



THE FOURTH MYSTERY

The Holy Ghost in the Church.

The Meditation:

Suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting....and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak....the wonderful works of God. (Acts, II, 2, 4, 11.) The Practice:

Thank God for having made you a child of His Church which is ever animated and directed by the Divine Spirit, sent into this world for that purpose of the day of Pentecost. Hear and obey the Holy See, the infallible mouthpiece of the Holy Ghost, and the Church, the pillar and ground of truth. Uphold her doctrines, seek her interests, defend her rights.

THE FIFTH MYSTERY

The Holy Ghost in the soul of the just man and just woman.

The Meditation:

Know you not that you members are the temple of the Holy Ghost, Who is in you? (I Cor., VI, 19.)

Extinguish not the Spirit. (I Thess., V, 19.)

And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God whereby you are sealed unto the day of redemption. (Eph., IV, 30.)

The Practice:

Be ever mindful of the Holy Ghost Who is within you, and carefully cultivate purity of soul and body. Faithfully obey His Divine Inspirations so that you may bring forth the Fruits of the Spirit -- Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Benignity, Goodness, Long-suffering, Mildness, Faith, Modesty, Continency, Chastity.

Conclude with the "I believe" as a profession of faith. Say finally once Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory be to the Father, for the intentions of the Sovereign Pontiff.


The Holy Trinity Chaplet consists of a Holy Trinity medal, Holy Trinity Crucifix,7 white, 7 dark blue, and 7 crystal beads, a total of 21 beads in all.

How to pray The Holy Trinity Chaplet:

Begin by kissing the crucifix and make the sign of the cross as you say:

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit Amen.

On the Crucifix say the Prayer to the Holy Spirit On the White Beads say 7 Our Fathers (The Lord's Prayer) On the Blue Beads say 7 Hail Marys On the Clear Beads say 7 Glory Be To The Father On the The Medal say the The Apostles' Creed



The prayer to the Holy Spirit Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of thy Faithful; and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love. Send forth Thy Spirit and they shall be created, and thou shalt renew the face of the earth.


• Infant Jesus of Prague chaplet

With your heart filled with love and gratitude for all the Infant Jesus has accomplished for your salvation, devoutly recite His holy chaplet in the following manner. While meditating on the goodness of the Infant Jesus, whose Image is portrayed on the medal, say:

"Divine Infant Jesus, I adore Your Cross, and I accept all the crosses You will be pleased to send me. Adorable Trinity, I offer You, for the glory of the Holy Name of God, all the adorations of the Sacred Heart of the Holy Infant Jesus."



"And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us."

Follow each aspiration with an "Our Father" in honour of the Holy Family.

On each of the 12 beads, recite the same aspiration:

"And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us."

Follow each aspiration with a "Hail Mary" in honour of the 12 years of Our Lord's sacred Infancy.

In conclusion, recite the "Glory be to the Father..." And the invocation:

"Holy Infant Jesus, bless and protect us.



• Station of the cross, the way of the cross chaplet

The Chaplet of the Way of the Cross

This chaplet consists of 15 groups of 3 beads each, between which are medals representing the stations of the cross. An additional 6 beads are added as well as a crucifix.

A Suggested Way of Saying the Way of the Cross Rosary On the Crucifix say the Apostle's Creed.

On each of the following six beads:

- 1. An Act of Contrition.
- 2. Prayer to Jesus Christ Crucified:

Behold, O kind and most sweet Jesus, I cast myself on my knees in Your sight and with the most fervent desire of my soul I pray and beg You to impress upon my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope and charity, with true repentance for my sins, and a firm desire of amendment, while with deep affection and grief of soul I ponder within myself and mentally contemplate Your five most precious wounds: having before my eyes that which David spoke in prophecy: "They have pierced My hands and My feet; they have numbered all My bones."

- 3. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; an dmay all the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen
- 4. Our Father
- 5. Hail Mary
- 6. Glory be

For the intentions of the Holy Father: at each medal/station say: We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You, because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.

Followed by:

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be.



• Words from the cross chaplet

His words at first sounded sad, desperate and empty of hope but they were actually filled with love, mercy, peace, and encouragement.

This chaplet is composed of 33 beads representing the number of years Christ lived on earth. The first 2 beads are Hail Mary beads. They are prayed in devotion for the painful tears that Our Blessed Mother shed wile watching her only Child suffer and die on the cross. She too was in much agonizing pain while watching her Son being tortured so brutally.

The First Mystery

"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34)

These words of yours, O Lord, are a two edged sword; they cut both ways. They console me because I know myself as being as guilty as those who nailed you to the cross. Speak these words of forgiveness over me as well. But, at the same time though, these words fill me with dread. I understand that in your example I must pardon those persons who have harmed me - toward whom I nurse a powerful grudge. The imitation of Christ, to which I am pledged, is excruciatingly hard. I count on the strength of your example to serve me, and to be able to say and mean those words, Father forgive them.

Next 3 beads: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be to the Father.

The Second Mystery

"Amen I say to thee, this day thou shalt be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:43)

All I can think of in reading your words, O Lord, is the magnanimous return the good thief receives for his gentle kindness to you. He has spoken the only gracious words to reach your ears on that fateful day when he said that you weren't deserving of this punishment for you had done no evil. But what a massive reward he receives for those few words: heaven in return for a simple act of kindness. I hope that all the words I speak during prayer will bring down a similar avalanche of divine mercy onto me.

Next 3 beads: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be to the Father.

The Third Mystery

"Woman, behold thy Son . Behold thy mother." (John 19:26-27)

These desperate sounding words first appear to be a guarantee for the well being of your mother. It is not, but rather it is a gift - the gift of Mary as mother, to care for me, to guide me, to love me and to intercede to you for me. You give me a rare gift

indeed, a presence in my life, to make my heart gentle and my world beautiful. There are no limits to your generosity - giving me your mother.

Next 3 beads: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be to the Father.

The Fourth Mystery

"My God, My God, why hast thou forsaken me?." (Matt. 27:46)

These words are not words of despair, but words of trust taken from the opening of Psalm 22. Our ancestors trusted in the Father and He delivered them. To Him they cried out and were saved. In your darkest hour you placed your trust in the Father and by doing so, you show me to place my trust in You.

Next 3 beads: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be to the Father.

The Fifth Mystery

"I thirst." (John 19:28)

It is an irony that you who quench the thirst in people searching for truth and divine wisdom should in your darkest hour experience thirst. Considering your loss of blood from the scourging, and the noon day sun as you made your way up to Calvary, your thirst must have been monstrous; but, you endured patiently and lovingly for me.

Next 3 beads: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be to the Father.

The Sixth Mystery

"It is finished" (John 19:30)

At first, these words could seem to be desperate, sad and empty of hope. On second look, they appear to be those of encouragement. It is finished, that is to say, that you have reached you goal, your task is completed. There is a sense of fulfillment and even triumph in what you say. Your task in bringing the good word was completed as was the task of dying for our sins. I hope that in my time, I will be able to say in full honesty...It is finished - my task complete.

Next 3 beads: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be to the Father.

The Seventh Mystery

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." (Luke 23:46)

In these words you give me the formula for achieving peace and strength. You died commending your spirit to the Father. What would make more sense than at any critical moment than to put myself in God's hands? Just as Stephen died commending his spirit to you, I will place my life securely in your hands for safekeeping.

Next 3 beads: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be to the Father.

The Guardian Angel Chaplet consists of 10 beads, a Crucifix of Our Lord and a Guardian Angel medal.

How to Pray this chaplet:

On the medal pray the Guardian Angel prayer:

Angel of God my guardian dear, to whom God's love entrust me here. Ever this day be at my side to light and guard to rule and guide. Amen

On the set of seven beads pray:

The Glory be to the Father Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

On the set of three beads:

1 Our Father,

1 Hail Mary,

1 Glory Be to the father. All in honor of your Guardian Angel.

Conclude with the Prayer to St. Michael:

The Prayer to St. Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.




• Saint Gabriel the archangel chaplet

This chaplet consists of a medal of St. Gabriel the Archangel and 33 beads. The three sets of 11 beads each honor the 33 years of Our Savior's life. The two joining beads honor the Divinity and the Humanity of Jesus.

Begin the chaplet by praying:

Heavenly Father, through the salutation of the Archangel Gabriel, may we honor the Incarnation of Your Divine son.

Mother of our Savior, may we strive always to imitate your holy virtues and to respond to our Father. "Be it done unto me according to Thy Word."



On the three sets of 11 beads we pray:

Hail, full of grace, The Lord is with Thee: Blessed art though among women.

On the two center beads which join the three sets of 11 we pray

Behold thou shalt conceive in they womb, and shalt bring forth a son: and thou shalt call his name Jesus.

Saint Michael the archangel chaplet

Saint Michael, appearing one day to Antonia d'Astonac, a most devout Servant of God, told her that he wished to be honored by nine salutations corresponding to the nine Choirs of Angels, which should consist of one Our Father and three Hail Marys in honor of each of the Angelic Choirs.





Promises of St. Michael

Whoever would practice this devotion in his honor would have, when approaching the Holy Table, an escort of nine angels chosen from each of the Choirs. In addition, for the daily recital of these nine salutations, he promised his continual assistance and that of all the holy angels during life, and after death deliverance from Purgatory for themselves and all their relations.



How to say this Chaplet:

The chaplet begins with the invocation on the medal. Then say one Our Father and three Hail Marys after each of the nine salutations in honor of the nine Choir of Angels as follows

Invocation on the Medal:

O God, come to my assistance! O Lord, make haste to help me! Glory be to the Father.

First Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly Choir of Seraphim, may it please God to make us worthy to receive into our hearts the fire of his perfect charity. Amen.

(1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Second Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly Choir of Cherubim, may God in his good pleasure, grant us grace to abandon the ways of sin, and follow the path of Christian perfection. Amen.

(1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Third Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the sacred Choir of Thrones, may it please God to infuse into our hearts the spirit of true and sincere humility. Amen. (1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Fourth Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly Choir of the Dominations, may it please God to grant us grace to have dominion over our senses, and to correct our depraved passions. Amen.

(1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Fifth Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly Choir of the Powers, may God vouchsafe to keep our souls from the wiles and temptations of the devil. Amen. (1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Sixth Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the admirable heavenly Choir of the Virtues, may it please God to keep us from falling into temptation, and may He deliver us from evil. Amen.

(1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Seventh Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly Choir of Principalities, may it please God to fill our souls with the spirit of true and sincere obedience. Amen. (1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Eighth Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly Choir of Archangels, may it please God to grant us the gift of perseverance in the faith, and in all good works, that we may be thereby enabled to attain the glory of paradise. Amen. (1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Ninth Salutation

By the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly Choir of all the Angels, may God vouchsafe to grant us their guardianship through this mortal life, and after death a happy entrance into the everlasting glory of heaven. Amen (1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys)

Say an Our Fathers on each of the four large concluding beads:

The first one to St. Michael, The second one to St. Gabriel, The third one to St. Raphael, The fourth one to our Guardian Angel.

End this Chaplet with the following Anthem and prayer.

Anthem

Michael, glorious prince, chief and champion of the heavenly Host, guardian of the souls of men, conqueror of the rebel angels, steward of the palace of God under Jesus Christ, our worthy leader, endowed with superhuman excellence and virtues: vouchsafe to free us all from every ill, who with full confidence have recourse to thee; and by thy incomparable protection enable us to make progress every day in the faithful service of our God. V. Pray for us, most blessed Michael, Prince of the Church of Jesus Christ. R. That we may be made worthy of his promises.

Prayer

Almighty and Eternal God, who is thine own marvelous goodness and pity didst, for the common salvation of man, choose the glorious Archangel Michael to be the prince of the Church: make us worthy, we pray Thee, to be delivered by his beneficent protection from all our enemies, that, at the hour of our death, none of them may approach to harm us; rather do Thou vouchsafe unto us that by the same Archangel Michael, we may be introduced into the presence of thy most high and divine majesty. This chaplet consists of a medal of St. Raphael, three beads in honor of Mary, Queen of Angels, and nine beads in honor of the nine Angelic Choirs.

On the medal say: You are Raphael the Heale, You are Raphael the Guide You are Raphael the Companion Ever at Human Sorrow's side.

On the first 3 beads say

a Hail Marys to Mary, Queen of Angels.

On the other nine beads say the following prayer, once in honor of each of the nine Angelic Choirs

Power

Virtues

Dominions

Trones

Cherubim

Seraphim

Holly, holy, holy, Lord of God of Hosts

Heaven and earth are full of Your Glory.

Glory be to the Father; Glory be to the Son; Glory be to the Holy Spirit.

St. Raphael, Angel of health, of love, of joy and light, pray for us!



• Saint Uriel the archangel chaplet

This chaplet consists of a medal or a charm of Saint Uriel, three beads in honor of The Sacred Heart of Jesus, and nine beads in honor of the nine Angelic Choirs.

On the medal say:

O Holy Angel St. Uriel, whose name means "God is my Light" We pray that you will guide our thoughts and actions with the Light of Christ. We ask that you guard and protect us against all the attacks of Satan Who has tempted man since the Garden of Eden. May you and all the choirs of Angels intercede for us before the Most Holy Trinity That we may receive mercy and eternal life in heaven, We ask this through Christ our Lord, Amen.



On the first 3 beads say:

St. Uriel, intercede for us that our hearts may burn with the fire of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Followed by: 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be

On the other nine beads say the Sanctus, once in honor of each of the nine Angelic Choirs:

5. Souls In Purgatory Collection:

• Chaplet for the dead, rosary

This rosary consists of four decades (40 beads) in memory of the forty hours which Our Lord is thought to have spent in Limbo. There are also the 5 introductory beads as on the Dominican Rosary.

One begins and ends this chaplet with the De profundis or an Our Father and Hail Mary.

On the large beads is made acts of faith, hope, and charity. On each small bead is said: "Sweet Heart of Mary, be my salvation." Each decade is concluded with: "Eternal rest grant unto them, etc."
